THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

If you've even driven through the main drive at Dr. P. Phillips Hospital you can't miss the signs for the Perry Pavilion and, like most, probably wondered what it was. This morning we're fortunate to have the founders of the Perry Pavilion tell you their story of how they bring their caring for people from around the world faced with a crisis here in Orlando.

It started more than 10 years ago, physicians and staff identified the critical need for overnight hospitality accommodations. Shortly thereafter, Hubbard House was built and became the first hospitality home on the Orlando Health campus. Located near ORMC, Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children Women, and MD Anderson Cancer Center Orlando, Hubbard House is a 21-guest room Victorian Home. The second hospitality home, the Cynthia C. & William E. Perry Pavilion was built in 2004. The Perry Pavilion is a 12-guest room facility that is attached to Dr. P. Phillips Hospital. These facilities provide lodging in a caring and supportive environment for families who are far from home and whose loved ones are receiving medical care within an Orlando Health hospital.

Before these hospitality homes were built, it was not unusual to find family members of our patients sleeping in the waiting areas, hallways, or patient rooms because they were afraid to move too far from a loved one who was critically ill. Other family members remained because they could not afford an extended stay in a nearby hotel. Orlando Health wanted to help. Our motivation was simple. We



wanted to ensure that during prolonged hospital stays, our patients did not feel the loneliness of not having family members nearby and wanted to make it possible for family members to be with loved ones during serious medical situations. This is why the Hubbard House and Cynthia C. & William E. Perry Pavilion were built - to improve patient care and to meet the hospitality needs of hundreds of families each year.

These facilities offer many amenities of home while providing easy access to key hospital areas. Creating a warm and inviting environment for families has been a longtime commitment for Cindy and Bill Perry and many other supporters, who have helped lead this hospitality initiative.

Cindy and Bill Perry's commitment to hospitality developed from a lonely hospital experience they endured when their first son was born. Cindy and Bill were traveling away from their home when Cindy went into labor prematurely and didn't have time to drive home. During the days that followed, Cindy's mother and father drove several hours to reach Cindy for a visit, but were allowed to stay for only one hour at a time. With nowhere to go, they were forced to turn immediately around for the long ride home. As difficult as it was for Cindy's parents, it was even more difficult for Cindy.

Cindy and Bill's experience fueled their passion to care for the needs of other patients and family members who are away from home.

Proceeds from the event support 4C, Community Coordinated Care for Children, as the main beneficiary.



This past week marked the 10th Anniversary of a watershed moment in all of our lives: the terrorist attacks on the United States. Like you, the non-stop television coverage both gave me time to reflect on all that is truly important in my life while, at the same time, bringing back some searing memories. Of course, my memories of being near the Pentagon when it was attacked that day pale in comparison to our recent speaker, Steve Leichner, who kept us spellbound with his detailed account of the moments after the attacks on the World Trade Center towers and his narrow escape.

I hesitated when I first decided to call that moment “watershed” but admittedly, much has changed in our country since then. I can no longer run out to the gate at the airport to catch a last-minute flight; police have gone from carrying 38 revolvers in my day to magnetometers now to capture radioactivity; we’ve given up a bit of privacy to ensure our safety, and much more.
